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Quasimodo Geniti (Easter 2) April 27th-- anno Domini 2025

Quasimodo Geniti means "Like newborn babes," the first words of our Introit for this morning. These words come from 1 Peter 2:2, and they express the faith that Jesus bestows on us by his Word. Faith is passively receiving the salvation Christ gives us in his Word. This is the faith that Jesus teaches Thomas about. "Blessed are those who do not see yet believe," he says. Those who hear the Word of God and keep it as their dearest treasure in both life and death are like newborn babes thirsting for that pure spiritual milk of God's Word.

This is why John wrote his account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. "These things were written," John says, "so that you might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name." This is why the entire Bible is written, just as St. Paul writes (Rom 15:4), "whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope." The Word of God is given for our comfort. It is given to give us a clear conscience before God (1 Pet 3:21). This is what it means to have peace with God. And this is why Jesus declares after his resurrection, "Peace to you."

This is why God's Word is proclaimed. This is why Jesus rose from the dead. And this is what faith clings to. It clings to the peace we have with God, since we have been justified by Christ (Rom 5:1). Jesus appeared to Thomas because he needed to be a witness of the Resurrection (Acts 1:21-22). And yet Jesus willed that Thomas believe based upon the Word proclaimed to him by the other apostles. Even after his apostles witnessed his Resurrection, it was still Jesus' will that he would sustain them by his Word (John 17:17). So this is his will for us, as we depend on it like infants depend on their mother's milk.

¹The LORD laid His hand on me and by His Spirit took me out and put me down in the middle of a valley that was full of bones. ²He led me past them all around. There were a great number lying on the floor of the valley, and they were very dry.

³ "Son of man," He asked me, "can these bones become alive?"

"Lord GOD," I answered, "You know."

^{4"}Prophesy about these bones," He told me, "and say to them: 'Dry bones, listen to what the LORD says. ⁵The Lord GOD says this to these bones: I will make breath enter into you, and you will live. ⁶I will put sinews on you, have flesh come on you, cover you with skin, and put breath in you so you will live and know I am the LORD.'"

⁷I prophesied as I was ordered, and as I prophesied, there was a noise and a rustling as the bones came together, one bone to another. ⁸I saw sinews coming on them. Flesh came on them, and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them.

9"Prophesy to the breath," He told me. "Prophesy, son of man, and tell the breath, 'The Lord GOD says this: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain people so they will live.' " 10So I prophesied as He ordered me, and breath entered

into them and they stood on their feet — a very great army.

¹¹"Son of man," He said to me, "these bones are all the people of Israel. They are saying, 'Our bones are dry, and we've lost all hope. We're completely cut off.' ¹²So prophesy and tell them, 'The Lord GOD says this: I will open your graves and raise you out of them, O My people, and bring you to the land of Israel. ¹³Then you will know I am the LORD when I open your graves and raise you out of your graves, O My people. ¹⁴I will put My Spirit in you so you will live, and I will settle you in your own land. Then you will know I the LORD said it and I did it, says the LORD.' "

Epistle 9 1 John 5:4-10

⁴Every child of God conquers the world. Our faith is the victory over the world. ⁵Who conquers the world but he who believes Jesus is God's Son? ⁶This is He Who came by water and blood — Jesus Christ; not by water only, but by water and blood. And the Spirit is telling the truth because the Spirit is the Truth. ⁷There are three who bring us the truth: ⁸the Spirit, the water, and the blood, and these three have one purpose.

⁹If we accept the testimony of men, God's testimony is greater because God's testimony is the truth He told about His Son. ¹⁰If you believe in God's Son, you have in you the testimony of the truth. Anyone who will not believe God has made Him a liar because he hasn't believed the truth God told about His Son.

³⁰His disciples saw Jesus do many other miracles that are not written in this book. ³¹But these things are written so that you believe Jesus is the Christ, God's Son, and by believing have life in His name.

The Augsburg Confession

Article XVI. Of Civil Affairs.

1 Of Civil Affairs they teach that lawful civil ordinances are good works of God, and that 2 it is right for Christians to bear civil office, to sit as judges, to judge matters by the Imperial and other existing laws, to award just punishments, to engage in just wars, to serve as soldiers, to make legal contracts, to hold property, to make oath when required by the magistrates, to marry a wife, to be given in marriage.

3 They condemn the Anabaptists who forbid these civil offices to Christians.

4 They condemn also those who do not place evangelical perfection in the fear of God and in faith, but in forsaking civil offices, for 5 the Gospel teaches an eternal righteousness of the heart. Meanwhile, it does not destroy the State or the family, but very much requires that they be preserved as ordinances of God, and that charity be practiced in such 6 ordinances. Therefore, Christians are necessarily bound to obey their own magistrates 7 and laws save only when commanded to sin; for then they ought to obey God rather than men. Acts 5:29.
